Research aim

To assess the current viability of heritage crafts in the UK and identify those crafts which are most at risk of disappearing.

A heritage craft is considered to be viable if there are sufficient craftspeople to transmit the craft skills to the next generation.








Findings

- 4 extinct (in the last ten years)
- 17 critically endangered
- 45 endangered
- 93 currently viable
- 8 data deficient







Issues affecting crafts

- Ageing skilled workforce
- Loss of craft skills
- Market issues
- Supply of raw materials, allied materials and tools
- Small business issues
- Training issues
- Recruitment issues







Training issues

- Loss of apprenticeships
- Closure of further/higher education courses
- Prevalence of short courses
- Qualifications issues
- Costs of training to trainer







Recruitment issues

- Lack of awareness of crafts as a career
- Lack of craft-oriented careers advice in schools
- Difficulties finding trainees with basic skills
- Lack of making in schools
- Difficulties finding younger trainees
