# Switched on to Art

Arts Council funded Grants for the Arts (£15,000 with £15,000 match) explored new ways to get Arts CPD and resources to subject leaders. The project was comprised of a rich programme of action learning networks, cultural events, conferences and seminars.

Within it a collaborative sketchbook project called Switchbook built a community of 38 arts leaders and young ambassadors working side-by-side, resourced by visits to cultural venues.

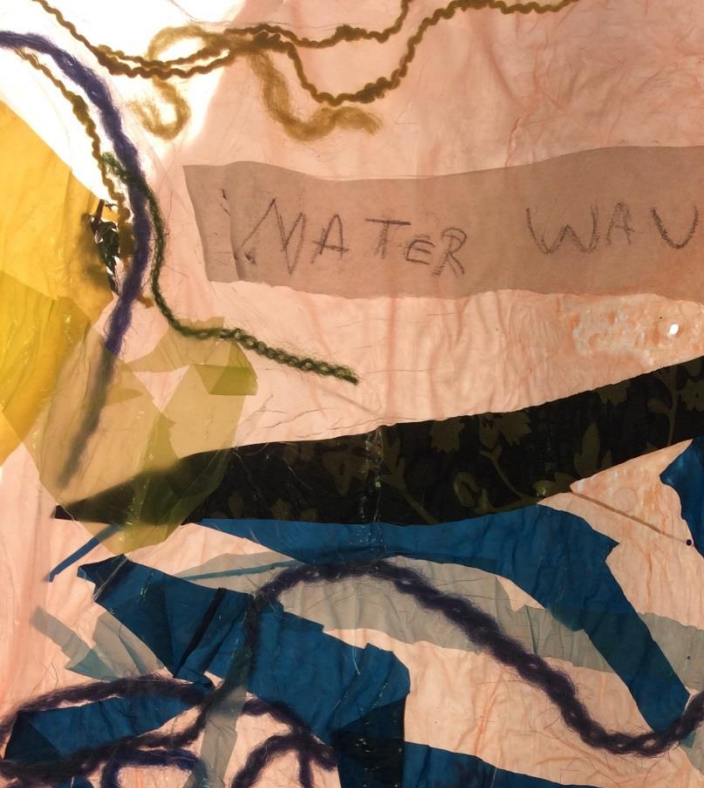
